Bertelsmann Brings Dr. Dietrich Grönemeyer onto 'Blue Sofa Gütersloh'

Gütersloh, March 21, 2023 – The international media company Bertelsmann is bringing one of Germany's best-known doctors, Prof. Dr. med. Dietrich Grönemeyer, to the Skylobby of Gütersloh's Theater on April 18 for the "Blue Sofa Gütersloh." This is the ninth time that the popular literature format has taken place locally. In the past, bestselling authors such as Dörte Hansen, Wladimir Kaminer, Elke Heidenreich, Roland Kaiser and, most recently, Pinar Atalay took to the stage for the audience in Gütersloh. Dr. Grönemeyer will talk with presenter Ariane Binder (ARD) about his book "Medizin verändern. Heilung braucht Zuwendung, Vertrauen und Mut zu neuen Wegen" (Changing Medicine. Healing requires attention, trust, and the courage to try new approaches). The book is published by Bertelsmann's Ludwig imprint. About Prof. Dr. med. Dietrich Grönemeyer

Prof. Dr. med. Dietrich Grönemeyer (born 1952) is a medical doctor, professor emeritus, and Chair of Radiology and Microtherapy at the University of Witten/Herdecke. He has worked for decades to promote education and prevention, and is an advocate of integrating natural and conventional medicine as well as psychosomatic, high-tech, and environmental medicine. He is a physician, scientist, innovator, and entrepreneur. In 1997, he founded the Grönemeyer Institute for Microtherapy in Bochum, later in Berlin and other cities. Dr. Dietrich Grönemeyer is the author of numerous bestsellers. His books have been translated into about 20 languages.

About the Book

No time for patients, no appreciation of the healthcare professions, overburdened hospitals, nursing shortages, a lack of doctors in rural areas, medical economics instead of optimum health care, and outdated infrastructures in the health care system: the list of shortcomings is long. In his book "Medizin verändern. Heilung braucht Zuwendung, Vertrauen und Mut zu neuen Wegen," Dr. Grönemeyer examines the entire healthcare system and shows practicable solutions for its reorganization. Such as the important role of the family doctor as the patient's manager, the creation of competence centers between hospitals and therapists in private practice; their digital networking with the health authorities as well; the promotion of telemedicine; the new role of nursing staff as co-pilots of the family doctor; and maintaining the independence of the elderly with high-tech or check-ups. The goal must be to get away

from organization that ignores the needs of humans, and the dictates of business and bureaucracy in medicine, to a dignified art of healing that balances high-tech and naturopathy, psychosomatics and environmental medicine. To achieve this, cutting-edge research and innovations are a basic prerequisite.

About Ariane Binder (Presenter)

Ariane Binder studied literature and cultural studies at Berlin's Humboldt University and theater studies at the University of Vienna, then did her internship at [the public-service southern German broadcaster] SWR. For four years she was in front of the camera for the program "Landesart." She has also served as senior editor and author for the broadcaster 3sat's cultural magazine show "Kulturzeit" since 2006. Since September 2018, she has hosted the culture magazine show "Kunscht!".

For years, Bertelsmann has been involved in cultural activities in a variety of ways - locally, nationally and internationally.
