Bestselling Author and Historian Christopher Clark on The Blue Sofa in Luxembourg

- The bestselling author speaks at the Institut Pierre Werner about his new book "Revolutionary Spring. Fighting for a New World 1848/49"
- Event on the occasion of the 175th anniversary of the Luxembourg Chamber of Deputies, the 20th anniversary of the Institut Pierre Werner, and the exhibition "1848 Revolutioun zu Lëtzebuerg"

Berlin/Luxembourg, September 13, 2023 – Bertelsmann's Blue Sofa is bringing one of the foremost historians of our time to Luxembourg: On September 29, bestselling author and Professor of Modern European History Christopher Clark will come to the Institut Pierre Werner to talk about his latest book as part of the by-now internationally renowned literary format. DVA, a division of Penguin Random House Verlagsgruppe, is publishing "Frühling der Revolution. Europa 1848/49 und der Kampf für eine neue Welt," the German edition of "Revolutionary Spring. Fighting for a New World 1848/49" on September 27.

The event ties in to the 175th anniversary of the revolutionary year 1848, in the wake of which the Luxembourg Chamber of Deputies was founded. The anniversary is being honored throughout Europe, with events including the Luxembourg National Archives' current exhibition "1848 Revolutioun zu Lëtzebuerg," being dedicated to this historical context. The venue of Professor Clark's talk, the Franco-German-Luxembourg Institut Pierre Werner (IPW), is also celebrating an anniversary: It was founded 20 years ago. Luxembourg author and literary critic Samuel Hamen will moderate the event on the Blue Sofa at the IPW. The event will be livestreamed by the Parliamentary Television of Luxembourg on https://www.chd.lu/fr/live.

This is the second time that Bertelsmann is bringing its Blue Sofa literary format, which has been well-known for many years in the German-speaking countries, to the Grand Duchy. The first Blue Sofa Luxembourg took place in June 2022 with four award-winning authors at the Bibliothèque nationale du Luxembourg. Luxembourg is also home to RTL Group, the international media, services, and education group's strongest division in terms of revenues.

Christopher Clark's spectacular new book recreates with verve, wit and insight this extraordinary period. Everywhere new political ideas, beliefs, and expectations surged forward. The role of women in society, the end of slavery, the right to work, national independence and the final emancipation of the Jews all became issues central to the people's lives— and they were willing to fight hard for them.

The ideas of 1848 spread around the world and – for better and sometimes much worse – a new and very different Europe emerged from the wreckage.

About the author

Christopher Clark, born in 1960, is Professor in Modern European History at St. Catharine's College, Cambridge. His research focuses on the history of Prussia. He is the author of a biography of Wilhelm II, the last German emperor. For his book "Prussia," he received the Wolfson History Prize in 2007 and in 2010 became the first non-German-speaking historian to receive the Preis des Historischen Kollegs, Germany's foremost prize for historians. His groundbreaking work on the First World War, "The Sleepwalkers" (2013), topped the German nonfiction bestseller list for weeks and was an international success. In 2018, he published the acclaimed bestseller "Time and Power," followed in 2020 by the critically acclaimed "Prisoners of Time." Christopher Clark became known to a wider TV audience as the host of the multi-part ZDF documentary series "Deutschland-Saga," "Europa-Saga," and "Welten-Saga." In 2022, he was awarded the Honorary Prize of the Bavarian Minister President.
